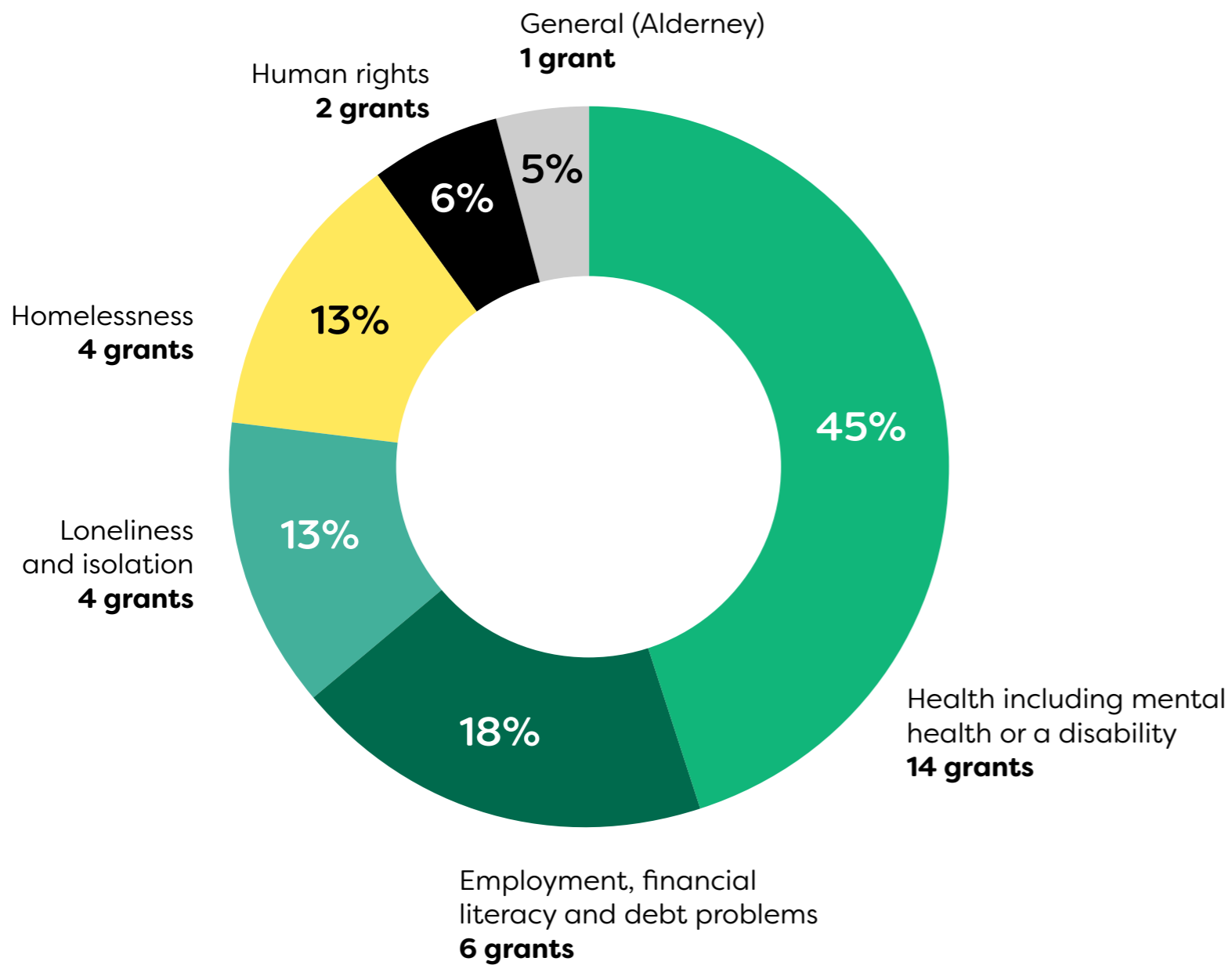

## Financial Resilience Fund

With our sister foundations: Bank of Scotland Foundation, Halifax Foundation for Northern Ireland, and Lloyds Bank Foundation for England and Wales, and thanks to an additional donation from Lloyds Banking Group, we launched a joint Financial Resilience Fund. £4.2 million was made available to the charity sector across the UK and Channel Islands to help empower those most in need by gaining confidence and skills to manage their finances, reduce reliance on debt and achieve long-term financial stability.

In the Channel Islands, £120,000 of unrestricted funding was awarded to four charities that work directly with people who are socially excluded and disadvantaged, supporting them with the challenges of financial insecurity.
